ANTI RAGGING/ DISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have Zero tolerance to ragging and its total elimination from the educational institutions. The Hon'ble supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th May, 2007 and 11th Feb. 2009 has directed as hereunder.

1. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the institution.
2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately.
3. Punishment for ragging includes:
 - I. Imprisonment/fine or both.
 - II. Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period and fine with a public apology.
 - III. Withholding scholarships of other benefits.
 - IV. Debarring from representation in events.
 - V. Withholding of result.
 - VI. Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and alike.
4. In the hostels, the entry of seniors and outsiders shall be prohibited before and after specified hours of the day except under the authority of the person in charge (warden or hostel superintendent).
5. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified collective punishment shall be resorted to.
6. Character/migration certificate(s) issued by the institution shall have an entry apart from that of general conduct and behavior to the effect whether the student had participated in particular was published for ragging.
7. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/indiscipline in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission shall be refused to him/her or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith.

ADMISSION UNDER CBCS (UGC):

The Govt. of Himachal Pradesh has introduced Choice Based Credit System under UGC and these regulations have been called the HPU Regulations for CBCS and Continuous Assessment Grading Pattern (CAGP) for UG Programmes.

DEFINITIONS:

Credit: It is a method/unit to measure the volume of the content, learning effort, achievement of learning and weightage of the course. The term credit refers to the weightage given to a course usually. In terms of instructional hours per week assigned to it for the purpose of credit determination. One lecture or tutorial of one hour a week and practical of two hours a week is considered as one credit.

The total minimum credits required for an undergraduate degree programme i.e. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(annual system) 132.

Tutorial Session Consists of participatory discussion/desk work/ problem solving/ brief seminar on a topic or any such other novel method that makes learners absorb and assimilate more effectively the contents delivered in a lecture session. Normally, the tutorial sheets prepared by the teacher are distributed in advance to help learner prepare for interaction systematically.

Practical / Practice session consists of hands on experience/ laboratory experiments/ Field Studies/Case studies that equip students to acquire the much required skill component

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): Continuous comprehensive assessment shall be carried out in the form of quizzes, assignments, group discussions, seminars, 1 class test/house exam and annual examination and shall be reflected in the syllabi for a course of study.

Course Offered in the College: B.A. with Core Course-I in various subjects; B.Sc. with Core Course-I in various subjects and B.Com. with Core Course-I in Commerce.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

1. A student pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P Board of School Education (or in case of *Shashtri*, passes in *PrakShashtri* from Sanskrit Colleges affiliated to the HPU) or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of the H.P. University.
- a. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. programme.
- b. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. programme.
- c. For applicant seeking admission in B.Com. 1st year eligible is 40% marks for those who have passed 10+2 from commerce stream. However, it is 45% for other students provided they have studied Mathematics/ Economics as compulsory subjects at 10+2 level. It is 33% for Girl students.
2. An applicant should not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl students only) as on 01/07/2025. The upper age limit is raised to 26 years for SC and ST applicants. However, in case of overage applicant the Vice Chancellor, H.P

University may allow a relaxation up to 6 months.

3. An applicant having passed 10+2 examination with English as one of the compulsory subjects from any Board/University recognized by H.P Govt. or H.P. University or Association of Indian Universities can seek admission.
4. Admission is also open to an applicant who has an equivalent degree from Foreign University/ Board/College which is recognized by H.P. Govt. or H.P. University or Association of Indian Universities provided the applicant fulfills the minimum eligibility conditions.
5. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidate.
6. Initially all admission shall be provisional and subject to the final approval by H.P. University.
7. Rules of admission are subject to change as per the H.P. University notifications issued from time to time.
8. Admission to the various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee constituted for the purpose.
9. Any gap of one year or more in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence/affidavit as the proof of his/her activities during the period of gap. Submission of false affidavit is a legal offence.
10. The applicant must fill up the Application Form in his/her handwriting and get it signed by his/her parents/local guardian.
11. The Application Form must be completed in all respects along with the following documents:
 - a. Attested copies of detailed marks card of the previous examinations passed. In case of non-receipt of this certificate, the applicant must attach the certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - b. Attested copy of **Matriculation Certificate** for verification of date of birth.
 - c. Original **Character certificate** from the institution last attended.
 - d. **Adhar card**
- e. Female candidates seeking admission in 1st year must provide Himachali **Bonafide Certificate** for exemption of tuition fee.
12. Applicant must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
13. Applicant coming from Boards/Universities other than H.P Board of School Education Dharamshala/H.P. University Shimla must provide migration certificate in original.
14. Persons with Disability (PWD) applicant seeking fee concession must furnish their status certificate of more than 40 % disability from the competent authority.

RULES OF REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

1. Applicants who have passed intermediate from Hindi Sahitya Samelan, Allahabad or Prabhakar are not eligible for admission in the first Year for three year degree course.
2. Any candidate who passed his/her 10+2 examination after the month of July every year is not eligible to take admission in 1st year in that particular year.
3. Any candidate who appeared in or passed his/her 10+2 examination without English as a subject shall not be eligible for admission in first year for three year degree course.
4. In spite of the eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during the previous years.
5. The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission without assigning any reasons.

MIGRATION

The migration of students migrating during the same course/session from any affiliated college or institution (including ICDEOL) to another affiliated college or institution shall be governed by the regulations framed by the Executive Council of the University from time to time.

CHOOSING PROGRAMME STUDY COURSES IN CBCS UNDER UGC

The UG programme under CBCS in a college affiliated to HP University will comprise of the following categories of courses:

1. **ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COMPULSORY COURSES (AECC)**
2. **SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SEC)**
3. **CORE COURSES**
4. **DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC ELECTIVE (DSE)**

5. GENERIC ELEVITIVE (GE)

As per the new CBCS System, a UG Degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core papers each in English and Hindi/ Modern Indian Languages, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses(AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and 2 papers from the list of Generic Elective papers.

For the Degree:

1. A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a College for a period not less than three academic sessions (and not more than five academic sessions), should have passed the examinations prescribed and fulfill such conditions as have been prescribed there for.
2. For the degree (B.A. / B. Sc. / B.Com.) the student will have to cumulate a minimum 132 successful credit hours of coursework over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission, provided that not more than three attempts will be allowed to pass a course.
3. The minimum pass marks for all the courses in CBCS (UGC) system for both CCA and ESE will be 35 per cent in each and 40 per cent in aggregate.

Duration (Time Frame):

1. The UG (TDC) programme for a regular student shall be for a minimum period of three years and a maximum of five years from the date of admission of the candidate. There shall be in each session not less than 180 working days with 1080 teaching clock hours (each working day having 6 teaching clock hours).

- The maximum number of seats in each core course I will be 80. The number of seats may be enhanced to 140 if the number of teachers in any subject will be more than one.
- The admission to the core course I will be done on the basis of the merit. Provided the

Evaluation: Evaluation system has the following two components:

i) **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA):**-It will account for 30% of the final grade in a phased manner.
 (a) **Class Room Attendance:** A student has to attend a minimum of 75 percent lectures/tutorials and practical failing which he/she will not be allowed to appear in ESE. The incentive for classroom attendance:-

75% but <80%	1 mark
80% but <85%	2 marks
85% but <90%	3 marks
90% but <95%	4 marks
Above 95%	5 marks

(b) **House Exams (HE):** There will be one H E in each year and it will be of 15 marks for all Year.

(c) **Seminar / Assignment / Attendance** –The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of class test/ seminar / assignment / quiz etc.

ii) **Annual Exams (AE):** The remaining 70 % of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of annual exams (AE) that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Grading:

- **Credit Weighed Marking System:** Performance of a student is evaluated in terms of earned credit weighed marking system. Earned credits are defined as the sum of course credits in which grade points above a certain cut off have been obtained for declaring learner pass in that course. In this way two performance indices emerge
- **Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)** for the current semester which is calculated on the basis of grade points obtained in all courses, except audit courses and courses in which satisfactory or course continuation has been awarded. $SGPA = \text{Points secured in the semester} / (\text{credits registered in the semester excluding audit, satisfactory courses and course continuation courses})$.
- **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)** for the student is calculated on the basis of all pass grades obtained in all courses, except audit courses and courses in which satisfactory or course continuation has been awarded, obtained in all completed semesters
 $CGPA = \sum(\text{course credits earned (Ci}) \times \text{Grade points (Gi)}) / \sum(\text{Total course credits (Ci in all the semesters except satisfactory, audit credits or course continuation credits)})$ Or $CGPA = \text{cumulative Points secured in all passed courses} / (\text{Cumulative earned credits excluding audit, satisfactory courses and course continuation courses})$.
- **Calculation of Grades for SGPA and CGPA** The marks obtained in the CCA and the ESE will be combined and used for the deciding of the course grade that the student will be getting. Grading will be done by the Office of the COE HPU for each course class and the grades will be assigned to the students in the class as follows:

These grades will not be counted for determining the Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulated Grade Point Average (CGPA) of the student.
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Determining GPA, SGPA and CGPA, Division and Merit positions for Medals etc.

For each student the Grade Point Average (GPA) and the Cumulated Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be determined by the CoE office of the HPU as follows: $SGPA = (\sum CiGi) / (\sum Ci)$ Where i is summed over the number of courses studied in the current semester. GPA or $CGPA = (\sum CiGi) / (\sum Ci)$, Where i here is summed over the number of courses studied in the past semesters as well as current semester. Where, Ci is the credit earned for course i (i varying from 1 to n) and Gi is the grade point obtained by the student in course i (i varying from 1 to n), n being the number of courses passed so far by a student.

- Exam Fee shall be paid by each student at the time of filling e-examination form online.

LEAVE RULES

1. Leave application should be countersigned by the parents/guardian of the student and must be submitted in advance in ordinary conditions.
2. Leave up to 3 days will be sanctioned by the Tutor and from 4 to 6 days will be sanctioned by the Principal.
3. Leave application after prolonged illness (more than 6 days) must be accompanied with medical fitness certificate and will be sanctioned by the Principal.

DISCIPLINE AND RAGGING

1. Discipline is essential to maintain the academic atmosphere in the college. Any student found creating indiscipline including ragging in the college shall be punished under rule framed by HPU.
2. Ragging is strictly prohibited inside and outside the college right from the time of beginning of the session/admission and is punishable offence according to **Hon'ble Supreme Court orders dated 04-05-2001, 16-05-2007 and 11-02-2009 and notification of UGC, New Delhi.**
3. **Himachal Pradesh University has framed the rules vide Notification No.1-14/HPU/DSW/08/360 Dated 10-07-2008 andas per these rules:**
Any student found involved in ragging will be punished appropriately which may include:
 - a. Expulsion from the college/university.
 - b. Suspension from classes.
 - c. Fine with a public apology.
 - d. Withholding scholarship or other benefits.
 - e. Debarring from the representation in events.
 - f. Legal proceeding under criminal law shall be initiated.
